Colin has been involved and has had an active interest in the work at Quebec Hall for many years. He has many attributes and experience to bring to his new role.

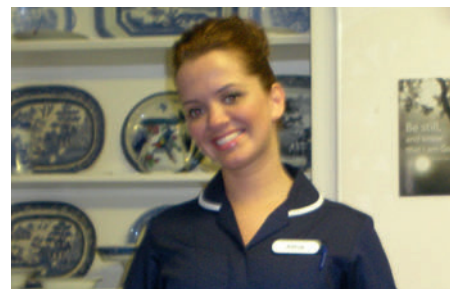
We wish him well in the task he has undertaken.
